Best Management Practices for Auto Recyclers

- Prevent contamination of authorized non-storm water discharges. Authorized discharges include water line flushing, land-scape irrigation, groundwater infiltration, potable water, foundation drains, air conditioning condensate, residential car washing, and fire fighting water.
- Eliminate un-authorized nonstorm water discharges. Unauthorized discharges include wash water, process wastewater, sanitary wastewater, building floor drains and sinks, and cooling water.
- 3. Conduct good housekeeping inspections.
- Equipment preventive maintenance. Inspect equipment or wear and leaks. Document the in-

- spection observations, and document repair work. Perform scheduled and preventive maintenance.
- Sweep paved areas. Sweep as often as needed to prevent the accumulation of sediment on pavement, and to reduce sediment wash off.
- Use catch basin filters or inserts. Install, clean, and maintain filters in all storm sewer inlets or catch basins. Filters may be removed during winter/spring where needed to avoid ice clogging and flooding.
- 7. Provide spill kits. Provide adequately stocked spill kits wherever fluids are used or stored. At a minimum, spill kits to be provided at fluid storage areas, vehicle processing and dismantling areas,

- equipment maintenance areas, and vehicle crushing areas (when crushing).
- 8. **Spill response.** Adequately respond and promptly clean up any significant spills or leaks of vehicle and equipment fluids. Properly prevent leaks and spills. During monthly inspections, document number of spills observed that were not properly cleaned up. SWPPP to define spill response procedures.
- Spill control training. Document annual spill control training of all facility (yard) employees and supervisors.
- 10. **Spill reporting.** Meet applicable State and Federal spill reporting and notification requirements.
- 11. Use non-structural erosion controls. Use non-structural erosion controls, including stone/gravel cover, vegetation, filters, and stabilization measures to control erosion, scouring, and excessive sediment runoff from unpaved roadways, drainage ways, and other un-paved areas.
- 12. Inspect and inventory incoming salvage vehicles. Inspect incoming vehicles for leaks and spills, and contain the leaks or immediately process the vehicles.
- Control fluids during parts dismantling and vehicle processing. Properly drain antifreeze,

- brake fluid, motor oil, and transmission fluid. Conduct all processing inside a building or outside on an appropriately designed hard surface. Use excellent housekeeping and spill controls, especially for outside processing.
- 14. **Drain fuel.** Safely drain gasoline and diesel fuel from salvage vehicles prior to long term storage or dismantling. Must be drained on an appropriately designed hard surface in an area with adequate ventilation.
- 15. Properly store and handle all vehicle and equipment fluids. Store fluids inside a building or outside in secondary containment. Follow State and Haz Com labeling and container/closure requirements.
- 16. Properly handle, store, and package batteries. Remove batteries from salvage vehicles, store batteries in a covered container or inside a building or covered storage area on impervious surface, store cracked batteries separately and contain and neutralize spilled acid, and ship batteries in covered contained or shrink-wrapped pallets.
- 17. Remove convenience light mercury switches, where present, from domestic (US brand) vehicles from year 2002 and older. Participate in the ELVS mercury switch removal program.
- 18. Washing vehicles and parts.

Wash in contained area or indoors. May use water-based systems that recycle and reuse the water, or solvent-based systems where the solvent is properly disposed of. Document solvent disposal.

- Dispose of trash and debris. Debris, trash, and other non-recyclable material to be properly contained and disposed.
- 20. **Properly store oily vehicle parts.** Engines, transmissions, and other oily parts to be stored under cover on an impervious surface, and the fluids contained. Radiators to be stored off the ground. Rear axles can be stored outside if sealed or drained and not leaking.
- 21. **Prepare vehicles for crushing.** Prior to crushing, fluids, convenience light mercury switches, batteries, and refrigerant to be removed from the vehicles. Excellent spill control and housekeeping to be used during the crushing operation. Clean up debris when crushing is completed.
- 22. Control fluid leaks or spills from outdoor processing or mobile equipment. Control and promptly clean up leaks and spills from loaders, forklifts, skid steers, crushers, trucks, and any other equipment.
- 23. Control ponding and drainage problems that may impact water quality.
- 24. Select and install structural controls and/or treatment systems when it is determined that other BMPs listed above do not adequately control storm water pollutants and protect the water quality of receiving waterways. Potential structural and treatment controls may include (but are not limited to): paving, buildings, roof systems, diversions, containment systems, retention ponds, vegetated /rock swales, bioretention, filtration systems, and commercial treatment systems.
- 25. Control any other significant pollution sources that are not adequately addressed by the best management practices listed above. Address 303(d) water use impairments and TMDL requirements.
